Sandy Hook (Gateway National Recreation Area - Highlands) "Sandy Hook is a truly spectacular and unique gem within Monmouth County, offering a diverse experience as part of the National Park System. This seven-mile barrier spit provides pristine beaches for swimming, sunbathing, and fishing, along with designated areas for surfing and birdwatching. What makes Sandy Hook truly stand out is its blend of natural beauty with rich history. At its northern tip lies **Fort Hancock**, a former U.S. Army post with fascinating historic structures, including the Sandy Hook Lighthouse (the oldest operating lighthouse in the U.S.) and the remains of military installations, offering a captivating glimpse into the past. Its preserved natural environment is a haven for wildlife and offers breathtaking views of the New York City skyline. Notably, **beach access here is more economical as fees are charged per carload, not per person, and seniors with a National Park System Senior Pass can enjoy free entry.**

- **What's Special:** Part of the National Park System (Gateway National Recreation Area), pristine natural beaches, historic Fort Hancock and military installations, Sandy Hook Lighthouse, excellent birdwatching, panoramic views of the NYC skyline, and unique, more affordable carload pricing.
- **Best For:** Nature lovers, history buffs, birdwatchers, families seeking a unique beach experience away from commercial boardwalks, those interested in coastal defense history, and budget-conscious visitors, especially seniors with park passes.
